The street sign on School Lane opposite the Village Hall was obscured by bushes., whilst there were weeds and brambles under the Church Lane street sign. Plants were overgrowing the pavement outside Cross Cottage on Ermine Street. There was ivy growing inside the bus shelter opposite the church. Hedges in most areas of the village are well-maintained although some on Beck Lane needed attention.
2	Community Facilities Community centres, village halls, schools, parks, playing fields, churchyards/cemeteries, chapel surrounds, war memorials and public noticeboards	40	39	There are good facilities in the village including a playground area set in a good-sized playing field. The Village Hall is also well-located and well-used. There are an impressive number of well-located and informative noticeboards around the village, although the noticeboard outside the Village Hall is not very accessible and the church noticeboard had limited information. The churchyard occupies a quiet and attractive site. The war memorial is well-maintained in a prominent site on Ermine Street.
3	Gardens & Community Areas Gardens, window boxes, hanging baskets, tubs and planters, community planting, public areas, and allotments	50	49	The village has some most attractive properties with colourful floral displays and effective planting e.g. number 29 and The Old Post Office on Ermine Street; Chapel House on Risby Road. There is good community planting at various locations around the village, e.g. on Haytons Lane, Church Lane and School Lane.
4	Other community features Shops, inns, farmsteads, workshops, business premises, advertisements and signposts	20	20	The village signs are very smart and well-maintained.

•	Playground School Lane opposite Village Hall	50	47	There is a reasonable range of equipment, a basketball court and good exercise equipment. The site is free of litter but there were a number of weeds under some of the equipment. The hedge on the north side of the playground needs trimming near the benches.
•	Churchyard St Bartholomews Church, Church Lane	50	48	The churchyard is attractively sited, bordered by mature trees. Some of the graves needed attention with saplings starting to grow between them in places. There were also some tall weeds by the wall at the edge of the churchyard. The newer part of the churchyard was well-maintained.
~	Community planting scheme	50	49	Good planting is a feature of the village with attractive wooden planters in many locations. There were attractive wall baskets and planters in front of the Village Hall. The entrances to the village are enhanced with effective wooden planters. There is also colourful planting at the junction of Beck Lane and Paul Lane.
•	War Memorial Paul Lane/Ermine Street, Appleby	50	48	The well-positioned war memorial has a large oak tree shading the whole site. Unfortunately, some of the lower branches restrict access and need trimming. There is sensible planting in a trough to the left of the simple but effective stone memorial. The whole site has a tidy gravel bed with well-maintained railings to the rear.
