Chicken Farm

Current status

The proposed Intensive Chicken Unit has still to be resolved. Flyers have been circulated and so everyone should be up to date in that respect.

There are very few people that have had anything positive to say about it and Residents have responded by making their feelings known to NLC Planning Department. The official closing date for comments is 30th September, but if you have still to make a submission, it may still be worth a try to do so.

It may still be some time before the application is put before the Planning Committee as the Case Officer has to summarise all the responses submitted and forward that to The Planning Committee which is made up from Ward Councillors in North Lincolnshire. Should the Committee oppose the Application then there could be an appeal against that decision which would lead to the Secretary of State appointing an Independent Inspector to review all the evidence and make the decision. The decisions are very much Policy bound and it is the interpretation of those Policies weighed against evidence that determine the outcome at all levels.

Parish Council has submitted an objection to the amended application as has The Appleby Conservation Group, which is made up of dedicated residents, some of whom were involved in developing our Neighbourhood Plan.

Parish Council Keeping You Informed

Starting with positive news Appleby Village received a Highly Commended award for in the Best Kept village Competition, which is a similar placing to last year, but we did get an extra overall all point and were just 5 points off 1st place. There are comments from the judges the judges in a separate article in the Newsletter. A big thank you to all who helped keep the planters watered, and well done to those who had a special mention in the critique. Special thank you to David Walker who tends to the War Memorial on a regular basis and Mike Fox who keeps an eye on things when David is away. Also a Special thank you to Terry and Maureen Beisty for looking after the grounds of St Bartholomews Church, a terrific effort.

The Coronavirus is still a big issue for North Lincolnshire albeit much lower than most places in the UK, but I'm told that the infection is on the rise in our County just the same. The Parish Council website www.applebypc.org.uk is kept up to date by our clerk Kerry via a link to the NLC website.

The virus has resulted with the election to replace two Ward councillors having to be cancelled, but Rob Waltham who is a Ward Councillor for Brigg and Wolds as well as being the Leader of North Lincs Council, does sit in on our Parish Council meetings to ensure that we still have a direct contact with NLC itself.

Our Parish Council meetings are being conducted via Zoom video service and are likely to be so for some time, so we haven't lost out on meetings, in fact I can report that there have been occasions when Councillors have been able to "attend" the meeting when away from home, or when they might not have been able to attend under normal circumstances. It has to be said that all our councillors show particular dedication to the role they play on residents behalf.

I also know that the Village Hall Committee are still working hard and also the WI are still being involved as much as the can safely do so.

The connection to the Ancholme Way at the River Ancholme from the Village is growing ever closer, and I believe that there is progress on completion of the Ancholme Way nearer to Ferriby.

Footpaths and Public Rights of Way

As mentioned in the Summer Newsletter, Parish Council has recently taken over the maintenance of the Parish Rights of Way by hiring in local contractors directly.

There is an on going maintenance issue with the public footpath between Appleby Village and the Station Area and we're looking for volunteers to set up a work group to work alongside the NLC Community Service Group – to clear the footpath ready for resurfacing. This would ensure that the footpath becomes available much sooner than if it was left for Local Council to complete alone.

Internet connections: Santon and Appleby Village now have fibre cables to the street which will make fibre to the property available dependent upon individual Service Providers. Work is in hand to try to introduce fibre all the way through to the Station Area, which at the moment is served by wireless internet providers as is Clapp Gate.

There have been plans mentioned regarding road repairs on Santon Lane which we are following up.

What was Haverholme House Residential Home, has been taken over by the Demeter House Group which is a special school catering for children and young people with social, emotional and behavioural difficulties. We welcome the staff and residents to our Parish.

the village hall things continue to be busy behind the scenes as we start to prepare for hopefully opening our doors once again... so here's a quick update...

In terms of the building itself we are now cracking on through our list of major repairs with our new main hall flooring being fitted in October, and work to underpin the north side of the building (following some cracks appearing from a drain/ ventilation collapse) and guttering replacement on the south side starting imminently. We also had an incredibly generous donation that has allowed us to fit a new ventilation system to the kitchens this month, which will help prevent damp in this end of the building. This donation was significant and has meant that an item urgently needed that we just couldn't afford could be funded. This kind benefactor wants to remain anonymous but, you know who you are and, I and the Committee would like to say a massive public thank you! As the building remains out of use it great to be able to get this much needed work done, and with our grant from the government, without a significant impact to our charity funds.



Oh and whilst saying thank you... I'd also like to say Thank you to Cliff Chase our cleaner, for keeping everything ticking over and keeping an eye on the hall during these strange times.

As lockdown restrictions are easing (well at the time of typing this they are, I know it changes daily!) we are starting to prepare in earnest for reopening, but it's fair to say things will not be back to 'normal' for probably some time. But we are making the building 'COVID' safe, with new cleaning processes being put in place, new signage and usage conditions, along with usage and infection spread preventative measures being now part of our new booking T&Cs. All in line and based on current guidelines from the government. We hope to be able to take bookings (although in a restricted way) from October, however all regular meetings and group sessions at the hall remain cancelled at this time. The football teams use of the field for this season will hopefully start from early October and the field will continue to remain open to all as it has been throughout. Thank you for not abusing the equipment or the grounds.

The 100 club still continues and Jenny is still doing her rounds. For those who Jenny hasn't collected from yet who still want to join the draw Jenny will pop envelopes through doors with her address on for money/cheques to be brought to her if that's ok, due to her personal circumstances.

Flooding

A number of projects

We have a number of on-going projects at the moment. There are long standing issues with flooding from the field at the corner of Santon Lane and the B1207 at the Station Area, as well as long standing issues with the capability of the surface water drainage on Church Lane and the sewerage system within Appleby Village itself. A group consisting of members of Parish Council, specialist staff from NLC and Anglian Water met with residents to discuss those issues. Within two days of the meeting a specialised jetting team set to at the Station Area to try to alleviate the problem that impacts houses in that area, a week later the jetting team were at work on Church Lane and Beck Lane. Further work via a Capital Programme will be planned where required, but that will of course take more time.

Road Sweeping

Straw litter has not been as bad this year and the Parish Council have had discussions with NLC and local farmers to work on a solution to keep litter to a minimum. This includes general sweeping during the autumn when leaves can be a problem on Church Lane, along with asking for overhanging trees to be trimmed back. We arranged for leaves to be blown on to the road prior to the NLC sweeper doing it's job on the last occasion. However there is still an issue with material that is more stubborn and we're working on that.

Appleby received a Highly Commended for the Best Kept Village for 2020.

The judges made the following general comments

This is a lovely village with many attractive features and some very good community planting.

There are many lovely gardens in the village and residents are to be commended for the efforts they make to improve their environment. There were some good examples of excellent planting and floral displays, at 4 and 5 Paul Lane, 22, 26 and Byways on School Lane, Bamford Oaks on Vicarage Park, Chapel House on Rigby Road and Ye Olde Post Office and The Cottage on Ermine Street.

Many areas of the village benefit from some very good community planting. At the north entrance to the village on Ermine Street, there is a planted wooden trough and at the south entrance there is planting on both sides of the road. Other good planting can be found on the grass outside the bungalows on Paul Lane with a further planter at the junction with Beck Lane, on Churchside, at the junction of Church Lane and Hayton's Lane and by the bus stop and under the street sign on Hayton's Lane. Further planting is found on School Lane where there is a grassed area with a bench and three colourful planters.

The village signs are most attractive and other signs around the village are clear and well-maintained. There was a commendable absence of litter throughout the village.

JustGo replaces CallConnect bus service

A new smart bus service launched

In September a new smart bus service JustGo has been launched which will help connect thousands of people across rural North Lincolnshire with friends, family and community facilities.

The JustGo North Lincs on-demand service replaces CallConnect started taking bookings from September 1 through a new app, which is available on smart phones and tablets on Apple and Android.


Thousands of residents in rural towns and villages, including those that can travel for free, will benefit from this service.

JustGo, funded through North Lincolnshire Council's three-year, £9m community connectivity budget, allows users to choose where they get picked up from and where they get dropped off across hundreds of meeting points across the region.

The intelligent software then works out the best way to collect other passengers nearby and take them to their chosen destinations. The more the app is used the better the responsive transport becomes.
