Parish Council Keeping You Informed

Firstly an update to my opening 'good news' item in the autumn issue of 'Your Community Newsletter'. The Parish Council has obtained TWO grants - one for the proposed refurbishment of the play park on the field, the cost of which exceeds £28,000. The finance for this mainly comes from North Lincolnshire Council's 'Community Grant Scheme', with £5,000 from WREN plus £1,000 from the Parish Council. Another is for the Fitness Centre this is from Awards for All (or the National Lottery) of £8,900. Both projects should be completed by early Spring 2015. The play park will be closed from mid-December to mid-January for refurbishment.

As you may recall in the last edition there was a focus on Super High Speed Broadband for the rural community. This national programme is a government initiative being managed locally by the Council's North Lincolnshire Broadband Team (NLBB) in conjunction with BT OpenReach. The current rollout program excludes Appleby and whilst it does include Santon there will be no marked improvement in line speed due to technical issues. As a Parish Council we have a view that the future demand for High Speed Broadband will be a requirement. To this end there is an ongoing discussion with North Lincolnshire Council Officers about the provision of better broadband and how this can be achieved for both Santon and Appleby. I will keep you informed on progress in the next newsletter.

Grass verges in the village are taking a bit of a 'hammering' lately, due to parked vehicles blocking narrow lanes and larger vehicles requiring access. On behalf of the Parish Council could I please ask that if you have visitors can you request that they park their vehicles in a driveway or some other area away from the narrow lane but please please never on the grass verges. We have school and 'service' buses in the village, along with delivery vehicles as well as farm vehicles, who all need a clear path

Now a 'not so good news' piece. The allotment idea planned for the village next to the Church is proving to be an insurmountable obstacle. The costs of the lease plus land clearance, water provision and other outgoings makes the project expensive. With only 10 or more plots available it would appear to be too expensive to continue. The Parish Council are looking at other sites.

Residents in Santon and Appleby have raised concerns about HGV using our local roads. To this end the Parish Council is in discussions with local companies to review if there are alternatives economic routes which may assist in reducing the volume of trucks passing through the two villages. As yet nothing concrete to report but after two meetings some progress has been made. So work in progress.

The Neighbourhood Plans for the area, submitted in late autumn, have been accepted by North Lincolnshire Council. This will give us as the PC and residents a say in how we would like our village and surrounding area to be developed over the next 10 years or so. More information is outlined in this newsletter.

Appleby Village Hall AGM Chairman's Report

As a committee our responsibility encompasses the managing of the buildings use, its maintenance, and the organising of events designed to raise the funds necessary to fulfil these tasks. We rely on each of these events being sufficiently well attended In order for us to be successful.

The committee try to provide a regular calendar of mixed events, quiz and pub nights, BBQs, and themed food evenings each being included in this and we continue to search for new ideas which might appeal to a larger audience. These evenings serve to bring our community together in what we hope is an inviting atmosphere. Disappointingly despite individual leafleting, posters and the use of social network technology, three such events planned for March, May and June were cancelled due to a lack of interest.

The Village Hall continues to enjoy a wide variety of users - WI, Bingo, Parish Council meetings, children's parties, yoga classes, rural touring performances, popular musical events with local talent, the Annual Produce Show, and village meetings to discuss matters of local concern.

Maintenance of the hall is an ongoing issue and as with any building there is always something which needs repair or renewal through natural wear and tear. As with any building the deterioration of its construction materials is an inevitable process and attempting to halt this could be costly if allowed to go too far. In 2012 the committee identified the main areas of concern and some matters will need to be addressed sooner rather than later if we are to maintain the hall's physical integrity. For this we will be trying to access grant funding that may be available.



I would like to record my gratitude to members of the committee. Their contribution to advocating the hall as a place of social activity goes well beyond the attendance of a monthly meeting and the stirring of the odd pot of chilli. Whilst never seen as a burden, spreading the work involved would have great benefits and anyone willing to join in these efforts would be very welcome to the committee.

This view was shared by others in the community, who urged us to continue in one form or another.

So the group will continue under its new name with a watching brief to examine environmentally sensitive issues affecting any proposed development in the Appleby and Santon parish. In so doing, it will assist the Parish Council – on a non-political and totally impartial basis in considering such proposals.

Neighbourhood Plan

During the six week consultation period responses were received from several organisations including Sport England, Natural England and the National Farmers Union. These comments will be useful to inform the next stages .

Thanks go to Donna Longman from Santon and John Owston from Appleby who have joined the sub group.

Some examples of the issues identified for detailed consideration for inclusion in the plan are Heritage and the Environment, Housing, Infrastructure, Transport and Sustainable Community.

We are looking forward to working with the local planning officers from NLC to ensure we are applying the neighbourhood planning principles to ensure we get the best for Appleby and Santon.

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Neighbourhood Watch Update

Ivor Keyes Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinator

We have been asked by Safer Neighbourhoods to trial an initiative called Nominated Neighbour. This is for residents who feel vulnerable when cold callers arrive. The resident can show a card to a cold caller, either through a window, or a door that has a safety chain on and set, which shows that they don't want to discuss anything with the caller and which asks them to pass any information on to a neighbour who's address or telephone number is shown on the card. This has been taken up by a couple of people to date. A number of information packs have been distributed already but if you know of anyone who might benefit from the initiative an information pack is available.

Recorded crimes in September 2014

- 1 x Theft from a motor vehicle (Keys)
- Police were called to a dispute between neighbours, also with a report of glass on the road and when objects were thrown at the caller's car whilst driving.

Recorded crimes in October 2014

- 1 x Burglary not in dwelling, 1 x Theft (other), 1 x Action fraud.
- Police were called to four traffic incidents, an alleged assault and a threat of violence.

October was also notable for six reports of hare coursing. In response, officers attended on Carr Lane, Appleby and found three men with lurcher dogs who had been in the fields trespassing in search of hares. They were all reported for summons and their vehicle, a red Subaru estate car, was seized.
