# Village Hall

The refurbishment is almost complete and the Hall is now open for business as usual. The small meeting room has been brightened with energy saving lighting, a new ceiling, fresh paint and a new carpet. Whilst the Main Hall now looks light and bright with a light colour scheme and renovated floor. The area formerly known as the bistro has been transformed into a social café area, fully equipped with new cutlery, crockery and glassware. The lowered ceiling and lighting makes the room more 'cosy' and we hope that now the village will make the best of use of this new facility. The committee will be opening this café shortly for casual drop in sessions and also hope that organised groups will consider hiring it for themselves (more information will be posted on the Village Hall webpage soon).

Buttonswood - for their kind donation of timber, Container King for help with manpower clearing out the rooms prior to the works. The Villagers who have given their time to help in any way during the works.

To celebrate the reopening of the hall we are holding a **Pub Night** on the **5th March (7.30pm)** to which we hope the locals will come along and enjoy your new hall. At this evening we will be asking if residents would be willing to volunteer just a small amount of their time to support our 'vision' for this new social café; by helping to open the café, thinking of ways we can reach out to meet the social needs of the village, hiring the cafe for group gatherings. # Parish Council Keeping You Informed

Welcome to the Spring edition of the Your Community Newsletter which I am sure you'll find informative and full of articles that matter in your parish.

**Heating Oil Theft** Firstly the disturbing thefts of domestic heating oil towards the end of January. Whilst there is more details in the Neighbourhood Watch section on page 5 extra vigilance is requested. Where practicable to do so oil tanks should be made secure. Thanks to a number of residents 'watching out' and reporting their observations to the police arrest were made. If you see anything suspicious going on in the district, no matter how small, phone either 101, or if assessed as very urgent then 999.

**Replacing Service Bus №55** At some time over the next couple of months the №55 bus serving Santon and Appleby is due to be discontinued . The school bus service will remain unaltered, all other requirements for public transport will be taken care of by a new service named CallConnect. Once the date of discontinuation is known full information of how to book and use the CallConnect service will be circulated.

**High-speed broadband** As reported a number of times in the past Appleby Village will be connected to fibre optics cables through the Winterton exchange. Also, as mentioned in previous editions, due to unresolvable technical reasons other properties in the parish will not be connected to fibre optic cabling. Even so these properties are able to have the benefit of super-fast broadband by opting to connect

via a wireless system. The wireless option, which does require a small antenna on the roof, is operated by Quickline of Hull who recently upgraded their mast on Risby Top. Regarding Appleby village some may have seen that work has started with a new fibre optic cabinet now in position on Paul Lane. More on this can be found on page 3.



**The Neighbourhood Plan** is coming together as the working group are in discussions with interested parties, businesses and stakeholders to progress what we want to see in the next 10 to 15 years in our Parish. Further information on page 2.



**Santon speed limit** There is now a 20mph speed limit in Santon as we are having problems with heavy goods vehicles travelling through this narrow road to gain access to the steelworks.Full outline of this serious issue can be found on page 3

**Conservation Area** Within the parish as a whole Appleby Village (with a few exceptions) is a conservation area and as such <u>any</u> pruning or felling of trees has to have a Planning Application approved by North Lincolnshire Council before work is carried out. If you require further clarification about either Tree Preservation Orders (TPO) or Conservation Area (CA) status and how these affects any trees on your property Colin Horton from North Lincolnshire Council is attending the next Parish Council meeting on the **14th March** to explain what is required as far as Tree Preservation Orders (TPO) or Conservation Area (CA) permission is concerned.

The historic verges in Appleby village verges are again having some `punishment` from cars and tractors, mainly due to inconsiderate parking on our narrow lanes. If the lane is narrow outside your property, please try and park your car, and your visitors` vehicles, either in your own driveway or on a wider section of the lane, so that others can pass without having to travel over the soft grass verges.

## NLC ~Street Sport & On Target

How many times have you said or heard someone say "It's because there is nothing for young people to do"? Well keep reading because there is lots to do and plenty on offer, when you know where to look.

North Lincolnshire Council's Youth Sport programme provides a diverse range of multi sport opportunities across North Lincolnshire for young people aged eight to 19 years old. At present North Lincolnshire Council and its partners provide over 50 sessions per week.

Currently, there are 31 **Street Sport** sessions. A timetable is available online from www.northlincs.gov.uk/leisure/. The opportunities don't stop there, as part of the **On Target** programme there are a further 11 sessions running across North Lincolnshire.





The sessions provide a safe environment for young people to come along and get active, learn new skills, chill out with friends and maybe make some new ones and are informal and multi sport based,

For those participants over the age of 16 we offer the opportunity to become a volunteer. This means the young person will gain experience and access to training to improve their skills. This is the ideal starting point for anyone wanting a career in sports coaching and leadership.

# Appleby Parish Neighbourhood Plan

Following a lull over Christmas and the New Year work is now continuing on the Neighbourhood Plan. The Parish Council has applied for a grant to carry out the next consultation event. We are planning drop in sessions hopefully to accommodate those at home and those working. This event will be to bring residents up to date to ensure work carried out by the group is still in line with your wishes and also to finalise our vision for Appleby Parish for the next 15-20 years.

Background work is ongoing to update the Village Design Statement, as well as to consider traffic implications, employment and environmental aspects of the parish. Work carried out is for the parish as a whole not just Appleby village or the conservation area which have been well documented in the past.

Businesses with land or premises in the parish have been contacted to ascertain their future plans and wishes. If you are aware of any businesses which have not been contacted please let me know (email <a href="mailto:applebyparishplan@cloud.com">applebyparishplan@cloud.com</a>) so we can add them to our data base and rectify it.

As part of the residents' survey undertaken last year feedback was promised on views expressed in Section 5 'Anything to Add'. Some of the comments made were extensions of previous questions so will be added to those section, for example Housing, appropriate for ageing population and encouraging younger people to live here; footpaths and cycle paths easily accessible from the village;

Comments regarding Church maintenance and water being available for flowers on the graves have been forwarded to the Parochial Church Council (PCC). Lots of work has been undertaken within the church and grounds in the last quarter last year and those who attended services over Christmas were grateful for the new heating. The grounds were tidied up by villagers and although mains water is not possible at the present time a rain water collection butt may be possible.

Items regarding general maintenance of the village have been passed back to the Parish Council (PC) for information and action e.g. inappropriate parking; cars abandoned in gardens; over grown gardens in rented properties; provide assistance for those residents who need it, art installations around the village; request more decentralisation for the PC from NLC. The installation of Broadband is imminent - the PC will inform residents as soon as the timescale for implementation had been confirmed.

New issues raised will be considered by the team e.g. Purchase of land by the Parish for the villages in the parish for more green space for village use / pond / allotments, encourage mainline gas into the villages.

The date for the consultation will be circulated as soon as possible and I hope you will all take the opportunity to come and discuss your vision for the parish.

#### St Bartholomew's Church News

Work has been ongoing in the church since the last newsletter. New heaters have been installed, which are helping to create a warmer environment.

Also the old and unusable boiler has recently been removed from the vestry and all the subsequent asbestos has gone. A small amount of money has been reclaimed for the metal, which has gone into Church funds. The wooden vestry floor where the boiler stood is rotten and will need to be replaced. The electrics have been tested and renewed where necessary.

Work will commence shortly on repairing some of the North facing plain leaded windows and replacing some stained glass in the West window. The Windows will then be cleaned.

All this has been made possible by the efforts of villagers and friends over the past year by fundraising and physical efforts to assist.

# Traffic through Santon and Appleby

A further meeting with North Lincolnshire Council, TATA, Lafarge Tarmac (as was), Humberside Police and Parish residents has been held.

A number of residents expressed their concerns at the meeting. Although speed limits on Dawes Lane have been lowered to 20mph and the previously installed chicanes have been removed. Residents of both Santon and Appleby are still concerned about the volume of general traffic and HGV's through the Parish. The situation will continue to be monitored, both by TATA (as owners of this private road) and the villagers.

North Lincolnshire Councils legal team are to look at the possibility of amending the existing Road Traffic Order for Dawes Lane and further speed calming measures will be considered.

On a more positive note the maximum speed limit on Risby Road is be lowered to 50mph. However the number of HGV's exceeding 7.5 T weight limit on Risby Road is still a concern, as is the case on roads through Broughton.

We'll keep you posted.

# Super-fast Broadband

As mentioned by the Chairman in his opening remarks super-fast broadband will soon be available by cable to Appleby village,


In the past couple of weeks the cabinet for the Appleby Village fibre optic cables has been installed. All the adjacent ground work including power to the cabinet has been completed. The next step is to run the cable through the underground ducting from Winterton to the cabinet. It is expected that the work will be completed and up and running by the end of April if not before.

On **8th April between 10:00am and 12:00** all residents are invited to attend a rollout briefing by North Lincolnshire Broad Band (NLBB) on board their Rollout Bus which will be parked on the playing field across from the village hall.

A couple of points. There is no obligation to connect to super-fast broadband. If you do not wish to connect your phone cable everything remains connected as it is all the way to the Winterton exchange. If you do wish to connect you can select any provider you wish who will then arrange with BT Openreach to connect your copper cable line to the fibre cable cabinet. The cable to your home will remain connected to the copper cabinet.

The connection will be by what is known as Fibre to the Cabinet (FTTC) and works as per the illustrations below

What can you expect if you connect to superfast broadband by cable?

The table opposite shows the industry's standard of the speed you can expect in megabits per second (mbps) which then is dependant on the distance between your house as the cable 'flies' and the fibre connection cabinet on Paul Lane.

Current broadband speeds around the parish are around 1 mbps. Which means as the ratio of a one megabyte (1MB) data file is eight times bigger than 1 megabit (1 mbps) of 'speed' it would take 8 seconds to download. In future by reading off the distance/mbps table dividing the result by 8 will gives how many MBs of data files will down/upload in a second

# Appleby has a Little Free Library

Appleby is the first village to register a Little Free Library in Lincolnshire, or Yorkshire and beyond! You may not have heard of such a thing - we hadn't until recently although there are 1000's of Little Free Libraries all over the world - we are №35501. A visit to the Little Free Library Organisations website confirms that Appleby is now officially 'on the map'! So what is a Little Free Library?

Basically we are hosting a small library box situated outside The Thatched Cottage. It is filled with books of all genres and interests suitable for a wide range of readers, young

and old. Residents, friends, visitors to the parish and anyone else can just turn up (there's no need to register) have a browse and help themselves to a book (or three!) and then leave a book of their own in return. It really is that simple! It embodies many of the values we hold dear, particularly trust. The contents of the library are refreshed daily so there will always be something new to enjoy. Themed weeks are planned where special interests will be featured – Horror at Halloween and Baking prior to the Produce Show for example.







To stock the library we needed an initial supply of books and approached various organisations for help. The response was overwhelming. Tesco, Waitrose, and publishers Wordsworth Editions and Canongate Books have all donated books as have many residents as word of the initiative spread. We were delighted to receive funding for the construction of the library from Winterton & District Lions. A huge thank you to them! Thanks to Buttonswood too, And thank you, Ian, for installing it to perfection (and for your patience!). They have created the perfect Little Library for Appleby!

This really is a community project that seems to have struck a chord. In addition to the many positive comments from local residents, Andrew Percy has sent his support, BBC Radio Humberside conducted an interview and Lincolnshire Life Magazine is planning a feature!

# Neighbourhood Watch Update

It is nice to be able to report that Humberside Police are returning to a greater emphasis on Community Policing, and hopefully we'll see more of them around the Parish as a result. There had been general dissatisfaction expressed among the people of North Lincolnshire and it would appear that our concerns have been listened to.

As an update of the recent spate of thefts around Appleby of domestic fuel oil and lead, all of which may be connected, our Community Policing Team (emails as follows <a href="mailto:phill@humberside.pnn.police.uk">phillip.ONeill@humberside.pnn.police.uk</a> & <a href="mailto:Victoria.Petty@humberside.pnn.police.uk">Victoria.Petty@humberside.pnn.police.uk</a>) have put together the following report written by PCSO Vicky Petty:

"Regarding the lead thefts, a male and female in a Ford KA were arrested after their car was blocked in by police vehicles. A male was arrested at the scene, a police officer was injured after being struck by the suspect's vehicle and then the female driver was involved in a pursuit and she was arrested in Scunthorpe. Both were initially released due to a lack of evidence but were then re-arrested at a later date, as a result of new evidence whereby the lead from the Ford KA was recovered from Gallows Wood and found to match that stolen from the attacked premise.

I would like to add at this point that PC Brears and IO Brumby and Special Constable Barham (who all had hair ruined!!), are extremely grateful to the builder and the CSI Hall for standing with them in 45 degrees angled snow blizzard, freezing and cold. Both suspects were charged with theft of lead and the female with driving offences and assaulting a police officer. The most important thing to remember, is none of this would have been possible if not for the diligence, determination, and quick thinking of an Appleby resident who needs a big thank you from the village. A superb example of how local residents can play a significant part in helping police catch criminals."



Recently I was asked a question about the coverage of the Parish by Neighbourhood Watch co-ordinators, a list of which was published in the last Newsletter. We have twelve street co-ordinators around the Parish and all are volunteers, however when we talk about Neighbourhood Watch every resident can play their part. The 101 telephone service is there for all residents to use to report non emergency crime or other concerns and our vigilance was obviously helpful with the crimes referred to by Vicky Petty above. Making our own homes and assets secure is also an effective action we can all take to help prevent crime in the area.

The Neighbourhood Policing Report as we knew it for Appleby Parish has been discontinued and is replaced by crime figures report by Ward, which for us is Broughton and Appleby Ward, which includes Roxby and Dragonby, as well as Santon and Clapp Gate. Figures for the 12 months up to the end of Jan 2016 was 214, an increase of 41 reported crimes. Space doesn't permit for a breakdown but more information can be found by visiting www.police.uk

A Neighbourhood Watch meeting has been arranged for **Thursday 17th March 7pm** in the Village Hall. Please make an effort to attend. There is no agenda but your ideas can be helpful and feedback is always useful.

As footnote to this report, the following received from the Village Hall Committee:

"Village Hall Oil theft: Most of you will know that the hall was one of the victims of the spate of oil thefts in January. We commend those residents whose vigilance helped in the identification and the eventual arrest of the perpetrators. Thank you! The heating system is now restored to full working order, thank you if you helped with this too"




Santon has a new notice board. Funded by the Parish Council and positioned and erected by TATA Steel to whom we offer thanks, it was very kind of them to do this for us.

# Local Knowledge

Appleby Church was restored more than once in the 19th century. The font is late Norman and the tower up to the second "course" is early English. The pulpit embodies some fine old carvings representing scenes from the life of Joseph. In the upper panels of the pulpit coats of arms of local families were carved under the supervision of William Fowler of Winterton, who restored the Church in about 1815.

In 1913, during the alterations of Frodingham church, it was discovered that the silver chalice and patten then in use did not belong to Frodingham but had been lent to the church many years previously by the Vicar of Appleby. Frodingham copied the silver and the original was returned to Appleby Church.
