Caution Risby Road Winter Conditions



North Lincolnshire Council recently published their winter gritting program.

Once again Risby Road for it's entire length is excluded from the Precautionary Salting Routes and remains on the secondary salting group

Roads designated as secondary salting groups are only treated when all precautionary routes have been treated. However these will only be treated if:

- air temperatures remain below zero degrees centigrade for more than 24 hours continuously and/or
- there is a clearly identified problem caused by snow or ice on the highway

In light of last year's repairs and resurfacing work along with the increase in traffic on the route drivers are advice to take extra care when travelling on Risby Road when winter conditions prevail.

As mentioned in the last Newsletter Lynne Watson is taking some time off from our Clerk duties. Our best wished go to Lynne for the future and our thanks for the terrific job she has done for us. **Kerry McGrath** is our Clerk now until February 2021.

Clir Ian Hook has had to stand down from Parish Council. Ian has had some health issues that have limited his involvement, but that said, during his time with us has done some excellent work for us for which he deserves a special thanks.

Community Speed Watch (CSW) As part of talks with Safer Roads Humber we are supporting a Community Speed Watch project which will be manned by volunteer residents. Training is planned for 10 December and will be carried out by a Humberside Police Co-Ordinator Wayne Goodwin. CSW can only operate where there is no on going monitoring by Safer Roads Humber and so Ermine Street in the Village itself will not be included but the Station Area and Risby Road within the 30mph signs will. We're also hoping to have the same carried out at High Santon Villas.

Standing water on Dawes Lane has been an issue during the recent bad weather and we have been in close contact with British Steel re closures. British Steel can only move water off site at a controlled rate for Environmental reasons, which has meant that the build up of water on Dawes Lane has stayed around for much long than usual, where it is an issue in any case.

Drainage. During the heavy rain period, the bottom area of Appleby Village has had issues getting sewerage away from properties. Anglian Water deployed two tankers around the clock for close on two weeks to keep those sewerage issues under control. Ironically we had a representative from Anglian Water come to listen to concerns three months ago and we were promised a survey of the system to check for any restrictions. They were due back to report at the November meeting, however the second visit didn't happen which was very disappointing. More to follow as and when that information is available.

Surface water drains on Church Lane struggled to cope despite regular visits from NLC , fortunately they had gulped a number of drains around the village at our request prior to the rain coming and standing water was not as big an issue as it could have been. As most will know there have been a number of standing water issues on Ermine street between Appleby, Broughton and Winterton as well as on Santon Lane. (Continued on page 6)

A harvest supper was organised in October with pie and peas and Rev Alice led a short celebration. Thanks to everyone who contributed with desserts, raffle prizes and food for The Forge in Scunthorpe.

Our aim is to be complimentary to the Village Hall and the Forties Weekend and not in competition. We are looking to have concerts in the church over the spring and summer and are working with the forties weekend to have something in the church that weekend.

Also we are looking to do other events and will be starting a pudding club among other things in the spring so if you have favourite puddings you would like featured let us know.

There will be a carol service on the 23rd December at 7pm and afterwards there will be mince pies, nibbles and mulled wine in the Village Hall. Come along for a fun time and we will also have boards out with our proposed first fund raising project.

Our hope is to raise money for the repairs to the church through fundraising and the heritage lottery fund. There is a rich history in Appleby and John and Kate Yolland have been down to Lincoln at the archive and diocese to find out more. We hope to have a heritage area in the church in due course and be part of the heritage trail for historic churches. We hope to meet the diocese in the spring to discuss the work needed.

The committee want to also say thank you to Terry Beisty for his ongoing work keeping the church yard tidy, John and Rosemary Jeremiah and Ros Worsley for cleaning the interior of the church and helping with the recent Archdeacon visit and anyone else who has helped over the last year.

Wow! So there goes my first year as chairman, which has been a steep learning curve but a rewarding challenge I have very much enjoyed. I'd like to thank the Committee for their continued passion, commitment and drive, the trustees for their unwavering support, and all of you for your generosity and support of the village hall throughout the year.

What have we been up to this year... here's my brief(ish) update from our AGM held on 28 November, thanks to all those who attended...

Management Plan; our first act was to agree to and documented a concise but long term strategy that aligns to our constitution and our commitments, to ensure that we are all focused on the same agenda and priorities.

Building Heath; formal building survey commissioned which reaffirmed some known areas but also unfortunately identified a number of new and significant areas of which are all now out for tender that we will need to secure grants for due to the expected high costs.

Fundraising; the committee has continued to drive a schedule of events to the mantra of 'an event a month', with every effort continuing to reflect the wants, needs and tastes of the whole village. As always, we're open to suggestions and keen for volunteers or champions to help continue our efforts.

Finances; the hall remains in a strong financial position thanks to the great support of our community and our rigour around our spending. However, with our fayre day performance without revenue from use of the hall by the council, support from the parish council and larger event lettings from parties external to the village we wouldn't be in such a strong position this year. With spend pressures expected next year we do expect our financial position to suffer, but it is right to do this to secure the future of the hall.

Fayre Day; Although as I've mentioned before that this year's Fayre Day wasn't as successful as we would have liked, I'd like to mention briefly the great work that goes into this event not least by Robin but also the rest of the committee, their family and friends, the residents (past and present) of the village and our support group that stretches far and wide. Despite the financial performance of the event I personally have learnt a lot from this year's event and as a committee we are very much focused on coming back stronger next year.

Members & Roles; the drive for new members still continues and it's been great to welcome Lois, Barbara, Christine & Mary to the committee this year. My thanks also go to Clive and Terry, who have left the committee due to personal circumstances, for all their support given over the years. They will be dearly missed, but I'm sure will still very much be supportive of all we do and be regular faces at events in the future. John and myself have been re-elected into the position of treasurer and chair respectively, and Robin has kindly taken on the role of secretary.

For me in summary it's been a good year of foundation setting and we've made some good progress in key priority areas but we've got a long way to go. On the 2nd Tuesday in October the WI met in the Village hall. We had as usual a brief business update from Anne our Secretary and then our speaker was introduced. Leanne Smart a warden at Far Ings Nature Reserve spoke about the History and Wildlife at the reserve. Leanne commenced with slides of the different areas and pictures of some of the wildlife to be seen there. She explained about the upkeep of weed beds to encourage birds etc. and a lot of the hard work is done by volunteers. There has been an influx of mink which unfortunately take the fish and this has led to humane traps used to catch and remove safely to another habitat. Otters have been sited and these fellows deter the mink. Large Pike have moved in who then eat the smaller fish. These have been removed. Ponds are stocked up with more fish to encourage the larger birds. New bird hides have also been built by volunteers. As we can see from this information Leanne passed on life is very busy keeping a balance for the wildlife. There is also an area for children to pond dip and have educational talks. All this on our doorstep. It's certainly worth a visit. Thanks to Leanne for a very informative talk which everyone really enjoyed. The meeting closed with refreshments and a raffle.





November we had a demonstration on chocolate making by Paul North of Kirton in Lyndsey. We had a brief history how Paul became a chocolate maker after being given a chocolate making kit by his wife and daughter. He has not looked back and has a shop in Kirton called "No12". 
Village Hall Events Update


So that's it for now, planning is underway for the new year we have the next few months roughly planned out... watch this space... but any ideas suggestions and feedback always welcomed.






Road Accident Statistics for the North Lincolnshire

Casual Vacancy Appleby **Parish Council**

There is a vacancy for a Councillor on Appleby Parish Council. Should you be interested please contact the Parish Clerk Kerry McGrath with a short explanation of why you would like to be a Councillor. Kerry can be contacted on 07506 064148 or by email clerk@applebypc.org.uk.

Becoming a parish councillor is a rewarding experience and often described by those that get involved as a way of giving something back to their community. As a Councillor, your time will be well spent and will provide a sense of satisfaction. The council meet for approximately two hours once a month depending on what needs to be discussed. Council meetings are open to the public.

There are some basic requirements as below.

Qualifications to be a Councillor

A person is qualified to be elected and to be a councillor if they are a British,

Commonwealth, Irish or European Union citizen and on the relevant day (that is, the day of nomination or election) they are 18 or over. In addition, the person must meet at least one of the following criteria:-

- 1.Be registered as a Local Government Elector for the Parish on the current Electoral Register.
- 2. Has during the whole of the previous 12months occupied as tenant or owner any land or other premises in the Parish.
- 3. Has had his/her principal or only place of work in the previous 12months in the Parish of Appleby.
- 4. Has resided either in the Parish or within 3 miles thereof during the previous 12 months.

People that cannot become Councillors are as follows:

- 1. Paid officers (including the Clerks) of the council.
- 2. Bankrupts
- 3. Those subject to recent sentences of imprisonment
- 4. Being found guilty of corruption

Ancholme Valley Way work continues as do the talks with land owners to connect Carr Lane to the cycle path at Saxby Bridge., more on progress in the Spring edition.

A big thank you to residents who have maintained a watering regime on the Planters around the Parish. The Planters have looked well throughout the Summer and Winter plants are now in place, that is very much appreciated.

Playground. We have applied for a Grant from NLC to replace some of the tables and benches in the children's play area of the playing field. We expect the new benches to be in place early in the new year. Just over a year ago the Friendly 5 group of children donated £110 towards the playground and that money is being used towards the new benches and tables. Those children raised the money by spending their summer holidays working for residents. Future Community Champions all, and they have set a terrific example for everyone to get involved with our Parish. We always need volunteers to help with the Community groups and many hands make light work.

CallConnect Some of our residents have expressed concerns about the difficulty in obtaining suitable times for using the CallConnect Demand Response Service (DSR) that is currently in operation in the Parish, that being in lieu of a fixed bus We have written to the transport department of North Lincs Council to ask if there was a possibility of a single extra fixed service on one more day of the week but it was explained that the fixed services close to Appleby Parish were operated on a commercial basis and that the number of expected users wouldn't justify a bus company making an extra service available.

Regarding the Demand Responsive Service (DRS) they replied that they haven't got much to tell us at the moment as they have gone out for procurement of a new Demand Responsive Service to commence from April 2020 but at this stage they are still awaiting on the tenders been returned and then they have to evaluate etc.
